

Regional Mitigation Discussion



"The plan must include measures addressing the main GHG emission sectors: industry, electricity generation and/or use, transportation, commercial and residential buildings, agriculture, natural and working lands, and waste and materials management."

Sectors Identified for the MSA

- On-Road Transportation [passenger; public transit]
- Off-Road transportation [construction equipment etc.]
- Building energy [electricity and natural gas]
- Water
- Wastewater
- Agricultural sources [enteric fermentation; manure management, fertilizer use, etc.]
- Natural and working lands as a carbon sink*
 - *measures and actions for this sector will focus on increasing carbon sequestration on identified land cover types- not reducing emissions from this sector

Sectors included in the PCAP

- Building energy
- VMT reduction/EVs (On road and some off road transport)
- Carbon sequestration, organics and materials reuse

Sectors to be included in the CCAP that were not included in the PCAP


Santa Clara County Climate Collaborative Overview




- Utilize existing GHG inventories

Implementation Grant Overview

- Purpose: implement measures identified in PCAPs developed through the Planning Grant
- Eligible entities: lead organizations for CPRG planning grants, states, municipalities, air pollution control agencies, tribes, and groups of such entities
- Deadline: April 1, 2024
- Funding availability: \$4.3 billion for states and municipalities

Funding Availability

Applications will be evaluated against other applications within the same tier

Funding Parameters

- EPA encourages ambitious measures with a focus on scalability, innovation, and community benefits, especially in disadvantaged areas
- Must implement measures that will lead to significant GHG reductions
- EPA will not award multiple grants to implement the same measure in the same location
- EPA incentivizes eligible applicants to apply for funding together as a coalition (partners must sign MOAs)






Organization Map
